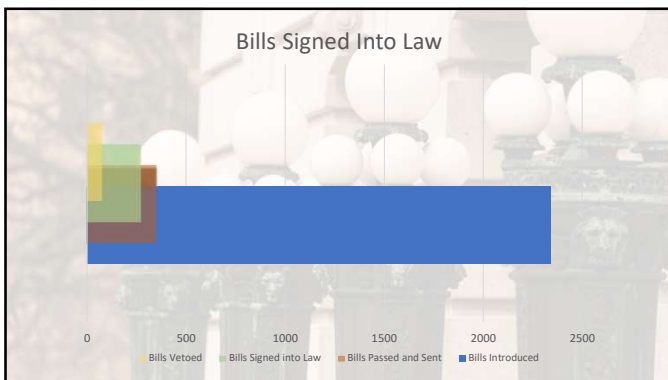

### WI Act 68: County of Residency

- Clarifies placements made by Family Care MCOs that the county of residence is where the member resided prior to the placement
- Residency determinations without this guidance will result in unequal impacts on receiving counties

### WI Act 55: Professional Counsellor Compact

- Authorize Wisconsin to join the interstate professional counsellor licensure compact.
- The compact will allow Wisconsin to recognize counsellor licenses issued by other states participating in the compact.

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### Wisconsin Act 119: Like-Kin Legislation

- Bill defines "like-kin" as someone with a significant emotional relationship
- Allows a court to place a child with unlicensed individual if they qualify as "like-kin"
- Bill allows first cousins once removed and like-kin persons to receive kinship care
- Changes the term used to refer to these persons from "kinship care relatives" to "kinship care providers"

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### Wisconsin Act 249: Crisis Now/CUCOF

- Crisis Now:
  1. "Someone to talk to" – 988 or County Crisis Lines
  2. "Someone to respond" – Mobile Crisis Response Teams; and
  3. "A safe place to go" – Crisis Urgent Care and Observation Facilities
- CUCOF framework is "a safe place to go"
- Smaller, more effective regional facilities
- Helping people recover in a safe, calming space close to home
- Designed for short term stays with local follow up services

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### Wisconsin Act 177: Waiver of IMD Restriction

- Require DHS to seek a federal waiver to allow federal Medicaid reimbursement for mental health treatment services in facilities considered IMDs
- Positive Impacts:
  - Providing funding to make it more sustainable for hospitals to maintain psych beds
  - Reduce demand on Mendota and Winnebago mental health institutes
  - Significant cost savings for counties
  - By supporting more beds in hospitals and centers, the waiver will reduce the amount of time law enforcement spends

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### Wisconsin Act 217: Xylazine Test Strips

- Non-opioid vet tranquilizer linked to overdoses nationwide
- Overdoses from Xylazine are as deadly as Fentanyl and harder to treat because it is not an opioid
- Bill excludes Xylazine test strips from the state's definition of "drug paraphernalia" which would allow for distribution
- Civil or criminal liability protection for those who distribute test strips
