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

The YoungStar system evaluates providers on 4 key areas:

- · Staff's education and training
- · Learning environment and curriculum
- Program's business and professional

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· Child's health and well-being

- The average price of center-based care for one infant is over **\$11,000** per year.
- That's 15% of the median household income.

## As of October 2023:

- Calculating subsidy on **full time/part time** basis, rather than paying for hours of service or smaller increments of time
- Paying provider's reasonable registration fees (up to \$125 per child for up to twice per year)
- · Impact:
  - The number of families, children, and providers remained consistent

  - o Monthly WI Shares spending increased by approximately \$4.5 million 
    \$0 ot 2022 30,055 children served; \$22.9 million spend 
    \$0 ot 2023 30,200 children served; \$27.5 million spend


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
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


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
